We celebrate Baptism:

Please call the Rectory well in advance of the expected day of Baptism to arrange an appointment for an interview.

Pre-baptismal meeting for parents is required. We require all Baptismal families to be registered at St. John's. Godparents must be confirmed, practicing Catholics. Generally Baptisms are celebrated the third Sunday of each month at 12:00 pm.

We celebrate Reconciliation:

Confessions are heard from 4:30-5:00 pm on Saturday. You may also make an appointment with one of the priests.

We celebrate Marriage:

Marriages should be arranged at least six months in advance. Participation in Pre-Cana is essential. Please call the Rectory to schedule an appointment with one of the priests.

We celebrate Anointing of the Sick:

Planning to enter the hospital for elective surgery or other serious treatment, and for those who have need of spiritual healing. In an emergency, call the Rectory at any time.

We celebrate Holy Orders:

Any gentleman interested in exploring the question of vocation to the priesthood or the permanent diaconate should contact Fr. George Torok. We would also be happy to direct anyone interested in living their lives as Religious Sisters or Brothers.

We celebrate the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults: We welcome you to full membership in the life of the Church. The instruction for Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist for adults.

Parish Registration: All adults (over age 21) should register in the parish themselves and should use envelopes or parishpay.com. Tithing is 5% of income. This registration is our only means of certifying anyone as a member of the parish, especially for Baptism and Confirmation sponsorship letters and for scheduling Baptisms and Weddings.

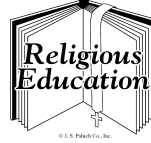

Our sixth annual blood drive scheduled for **Sunday, June 7th**.

Answers to common questions regarding giving blood:

- Donor age 16 needs parental permission; ages 17 through 75, no permission ; age 76 and over needs written permission from doctor.
- You need to have some identification with you, but your records will be kept confidential by the New York Blood Center.
- Most physical conditions and medications do not prevent you from giving blood. Bring a list of your medications if you are in doubt.
- You need to have something to eat and to drink before you donate blood.
- The blood donation itself takes only about twelve minutes, but you should count on being here for about an hour, including filling out the papers (basic information and your medical history) and resting and eating a snack (provided by the Blood Center) after you complete your donation.
- You are eligible to give blood again 56 days after your donation.

ANOINTING MASS AT ST. PAUL'S Saturday, June 6th – 12 Noon

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is a beautiful gift from God. It is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age." It is a sacrament which provides comfort, peace, courage and, if the sick person is unable to make confession, even forgives sin.

Whenever new illness develops or first illness relapses or worsens, the person may receive the sacrament a further time. It may also be given numerous times in the case of old age or chronic illness based on the pastoral judgment of the priest.

This is not to be confused with what we traditionally refer to as the "Last Rites" which involves a three-part reception of the sacraments of Anointing, Penance and the Holy Eucharist or Viaticum.

Light refreshments will be provided in the parish hall immediately following the mass. Please plan on attending this special Mass at Saint Paul, Congers, on Saturday, June 6th, at 12 noon.

Pentecost



At last! The power hinted at and the Spirit promised are unleashed on this holy day. We call it the birthday of the church. Scripture gives us some sense of how electrifying these events must have been to those who lived through them. Up until now, they have been waiting in the upper room. In today's readings, that room is filled with wind and fire and bold proclamations in foreign tongues.



The Spirit lives on in the church in each of us who are members of the Body of Christ, given different gifts from the same Spirit. Only after Pentecost could the apostles look back and understand what Jesus meant when he said, as reported in today's Gospel reading, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

In Sicily to this day, there is a custom of scattering rose petals down from the ceiling of church on the heads of the faithful, an effective reminder of the "tongues of flame" descending on the apostles, and a sign that the Holy Spirit still is poured out on the baptized. It is not merely a quaint custom, but a fairly potent sign of what baptism does.

Nuestra sexta campaña para recoger sangre tomará lugar el **domingo, 7 de junio**.
Respuestas a preguntas frecuentes con respecto a dar sangre:

- Los de 16 años necesitan permiso de los padres, de 17 a 75 años, no permiso necesario, y de 76 en adelante se necesita permiso escrito de un médico.
- Necesita llevar alguna clase de identificación, pero su información se mantendrá confidencialmente por el Centro de Sangre de Nueva York.
- La mayor parte de condiciones físicas y remedios no previenen dar sangre. Traiga una lista de sus remedios si tiene duda.
- Necesita comer o tomar algo antes de dar sangre.
- El acto de dar sangre toma más o menos sólo doce minutos, pero debe planear estar ahí una hora, llenando papeleo (información básica y su historia médica) y para descansar y comer alguna golosina (que el Centro da) después de haber dado su sangre.
- Puede dar sangre de nuevo 56 días después de su donación.
