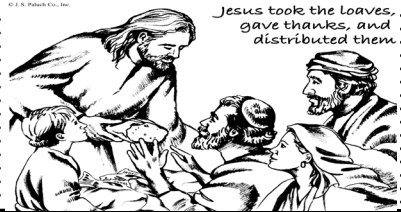


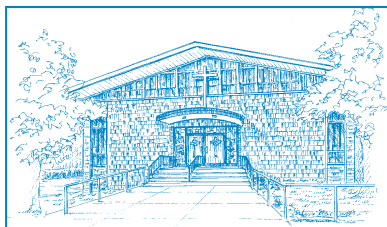

Marriages should be arranged at least six months in advance. Participation in Pre-Cana is essential. Please call the Rectory to schedule an appointment with one of the priests.

**We celebrate Anointing of the Sick:**

Planning to enter the hospital for elective surgery or other serious treatment, and for those who have need of spiritual healing. In an emergency, call the Rectory at any time.

**We celebrate Holy Orders:**

Any gentleman interested in exploring the question of vocation to the priesthood or the permanent diaconate should contact Fr. George Torok. We would also be happy to direct anyone interested in living their lives as Religious Sisters or Brothers.

Dear Parishioners,

I am now authorized to make an official announcement regarding the new pastoral assignments of the Oratorian Fathers in the New York Archdiocese.

First of all let it be known that Cardinal Dolan entrusted to the pastoral care of the Oratorian Fathers two additional parishes in Rockland County: St. Paul in Congers and St. Ann in Nyack. This is in addition to the parishes of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart in Tappan, and St. John The Baptist in

No substantial changes will take place in Our Lady of the Sacred Heart in Tappan:

Fr. Francis Conka will continue to be the pastor. However, Fr. Roman Palecko will become the parochial vicar of Fr. Vladimir Chripko the new pastor of St. Paul in Congers and St. Ann in Nyack. Fr. Roman will be replaced by Fr. Ravi Asari in the position of parochial vicar in Tappan. Whenever needed, Fr. John Dwyer and Fr. George Torok will continue to help as weekend associates.

Fr. George is retiring as administrator of the church of St. John The Baptist in Piermont. The new administrator will be Fr. Thomas Kunnel. At a later not too distant date, I will also announce the pastoral team of the church of St. Anne and the Catholic chaplaincy of Nyack hospital.

These are the most important changes and they will be effective as of August 1st 2015.

I want to assure you of continuity and stability that the Oratorian Fathers - with God's and your help - will provide to people of God entrusted to our pastoral care in the beloved parishes of OLSH, St John, St. Paul and St. Anne.

God blessed our Oratorian community with young priests and I entrust them, together with you, to the loving care of the holy and glorious Mother of God for many future years of fruitful ministry for the glory of God and for the salvation of many souls.

We come to serve you at the time of historic celebrations of the five hundredth Anniversary of the birth of St. Philip Neri, the holy and loving founder of Oratorian communities. We will embrace you with the warmth of his arms and plead with you, in his name, to offer us support with your prayers and much needed help.

### Prevention and Early Detection of Skin Cancer

**Protection:** The United States Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends easy options for protection from UV radiation:

- Seek shade, especially during midday hours. The hours from 10 am till 4 pm are the most hazardous for ultraviolet (UV) radiation exposure.
- Wear protective clothing: loose-fitting long-sleeved shirts and long pants made from tightly woven fabric. A dry t-shirt offers more protection than a wet one.
- Wear a hat with a wide brim to shade the face, head, ears, and neck. Remember that a baseball cap does not protect your ears or neck.
- The best sunglasses wrap around and block the UV rays from sneaking in the side. Use sunscreen with sun protective factor (SPF) 15 or higher.
- Avoid indoor tanning.

### Early Detection:

- Monitor your own body for any new or changing moles or sores.
- Consult your physician for an annual (or more frequent) check-up for full body skin screening.

2 Reyes 4:42-44; Sal 144; Efe 4:1-6; Juan 6:1-15

Al oír las narraciones de cómo Eliseo y Jesús multiplican los alimentos, y el salmo responsorial sobre como la mano del Señor nos alimenta, es fácil caer en la tentación de pasar por alto el maravilloso himno de la carta a los efesios en la Segunda lectura. El himno se centra en los números más potentes de la tradición bíblica: el uno, el tres y el siete. La médula del himno es el número uno, repetido siete veces. Tres de ellas se refieren a la Iglesia: un solo cuerpo, un solo Espíritu, como también una sola es la esperanza. Los próximos tres son los fundamentos de la Iglesia: un solo Señor, una sola fe, un solo bautismo. Y todos estos se juntan en un solo Dios y Padre de todos. La idea de repetir los milagros obrados por Eliseo y por Jesús al alimentar las multitudes nos desalienta, claro está, pero la carta a los efesios nos ofrece un modo más realizable de vivir como Iglesia y de alimentar a los demás en la Iglesia: ser siempre humildes y amables; ser comprensivos y soportarnos mutuamente con amor, y esforzarnos en mantenernos unidos en el Espíritu con el vínculo de la paz. ¿Quién de nosotros no puede "alimentar" a la comunidad de la Iglesia viviendo de esta manera? Prevenición y Detección Temprana del Cáncer de la Piel

Protección: El Centro de los Estados Unidos para el Control de Enfermedades (CDC) recomienda opciones fáciles para la protección contra la radiación de UV:

- Busque sombra, especialmente durante las horas de medio día. Las horas de 10 de la mañana hasta las 4 de la tarde son las más peligrosas para exponerse a la radiación ultravioleta (UV).
• Use ropa que proteja: mangas largas y sueltas y pantalones largos hechos de tela de tejido apretado. Una camiseta seca ofrece más protección que una mojada.
• Use un sombrero con borde ancho que cubra la cara, cabeza, orejas y cuello. Recuérdese que una gorra de béisbol no protege sus orejas o cuello.
• Las gafas de sol envolventes son las mejores que previenen que los rayos UV entren del lado.
• Usen un bronceador con filtro que protege contra el sol (SPF) 15 o más alto. Evite broncearse artificialmente.

Detección Temprana: Examine su propio cuerpo para ver si hay cambios en lunares o heridas. Consulte su médico anualmente (o más frecuentemente) para un examen de todo el cuerpo.
